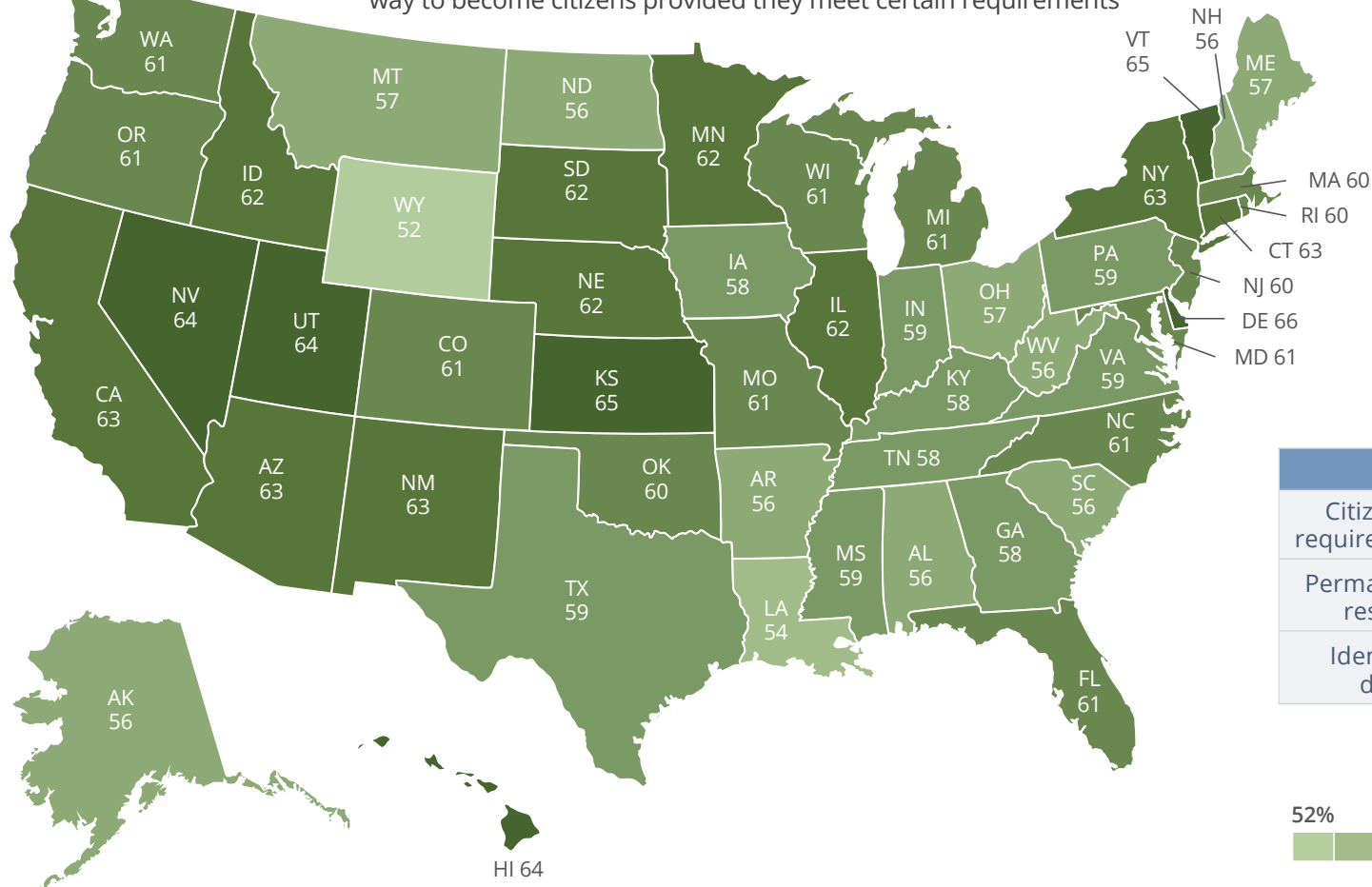

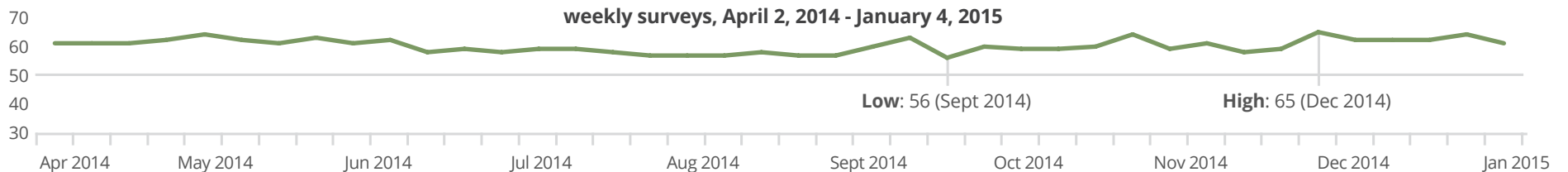
Percent who favor allowing immigrants living in the U.S. illegally a way to become citizens provided they meet certain requirements
