



Religious Affiliation by Age










Religious Affiliation in the U.S. 1974-2050






Racial/Ethnic Composition of Protestants 1974-2014






Racial/Ethnic Composition of Catholics 1974-2014





Religious Affiliation Among Millennials by Race/Ethnicity









Interreligious Interaction: Religious Composition of Close Friendship Circles





Trend: Perception of America as a Christian Nation






Perception of America as a Christian Nation by Age




Perception of America as a Christian NationBy age


How important do you think being a Christian is for being truly American?





American Muslims are an important part of the religious community in the U.S.







Most Americans have Limited Interaction with and Knowledge about Muslims

How much do you know about the religious beliefs and practices of Muslims?


