
Survey Methodology

- Conducted March 13 December 2, 2024, among a probability sample of 20,642 adults who are part of the Ipsos KnowledgePanel plus 1,618 state level opt-in oversamples, for a total sample of 22,260 adults.
- The margin of error for the full sample is +/- 0.84 percentage points and has a design effect of 1.6.
- The survey was made possible through the generous support of the Arcus

 Foundation, and the Unitarian Universalist Veatch Program at Shelter Rock.

Percent who support allowing same-sex marriage:








Support for Nondiscrimination Protections, by Party

Percent who favor nondiscrimination laws for LGBTQ people:



Percent who oppose allowing a small business owner to refuse to provide products or services to gay or lesbian people, if doing so violates their religious beliefs:




Opposition to Laws Restricting Gender Affirming Care for Minors, by Party
