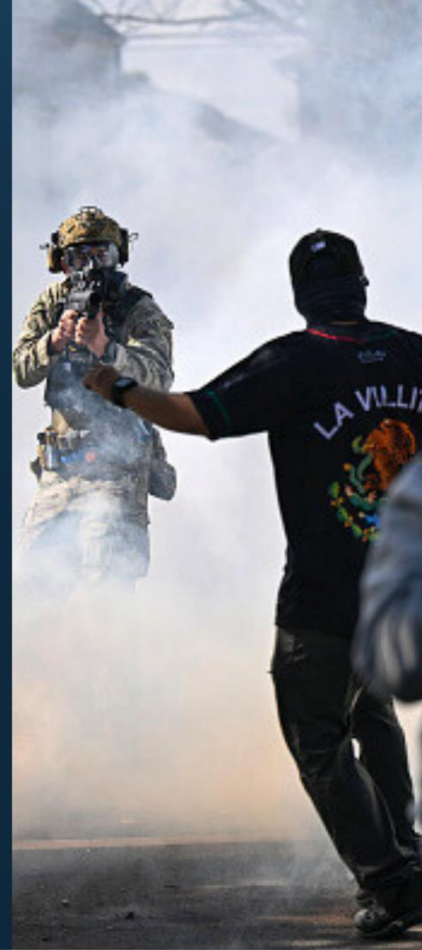

Survey Methodology

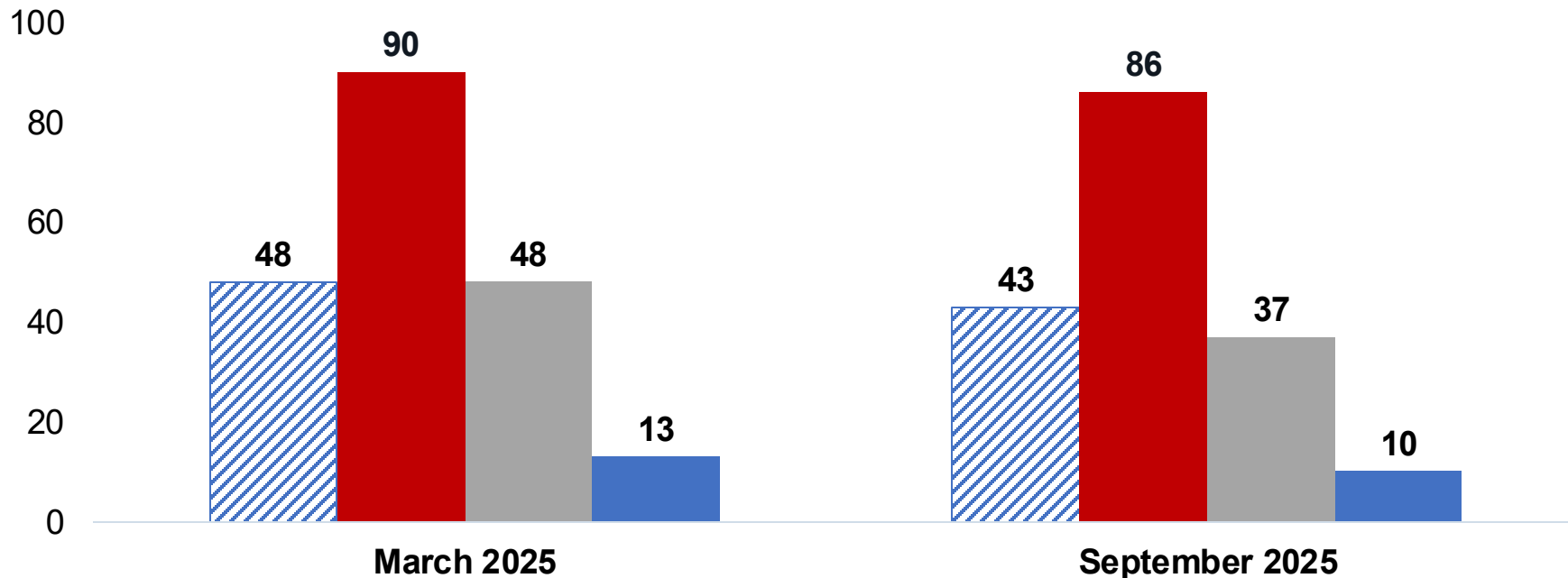
- Conducted August 15-September 8, 2025, among a representative random sample of 5,543 adults who are part of the Ipsos KnowledgePanel.
- The margin of error for the full sample is +/- 1.79 percentage points.
- Conducted in partnership with The Brookings Institution.
- Supported by the Carnegie Corporation of New York, with additional support from the Ford Foundation and the Unitarian Universalist Veatch Program at Shelter Rock.

Percent who approve of the job Trump is doing handling immigration:

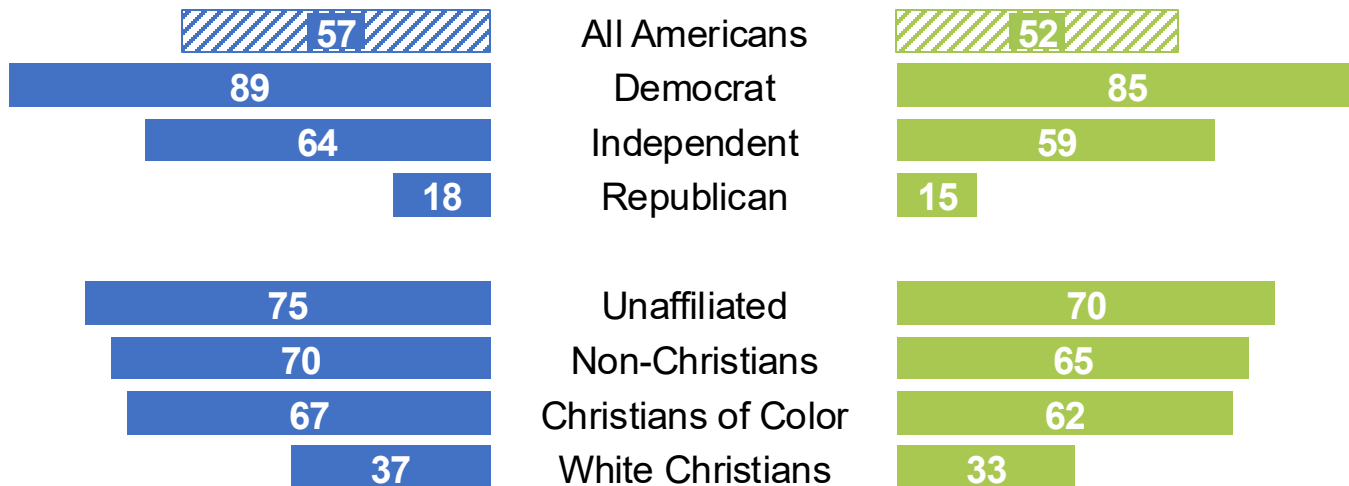
▨ All Americans ■ Republican ■ Independent ■ Democrat

- The increase in funding for ICE to speed up efforts to arrest, detain, and deport undocumented immigrants has gone too far.

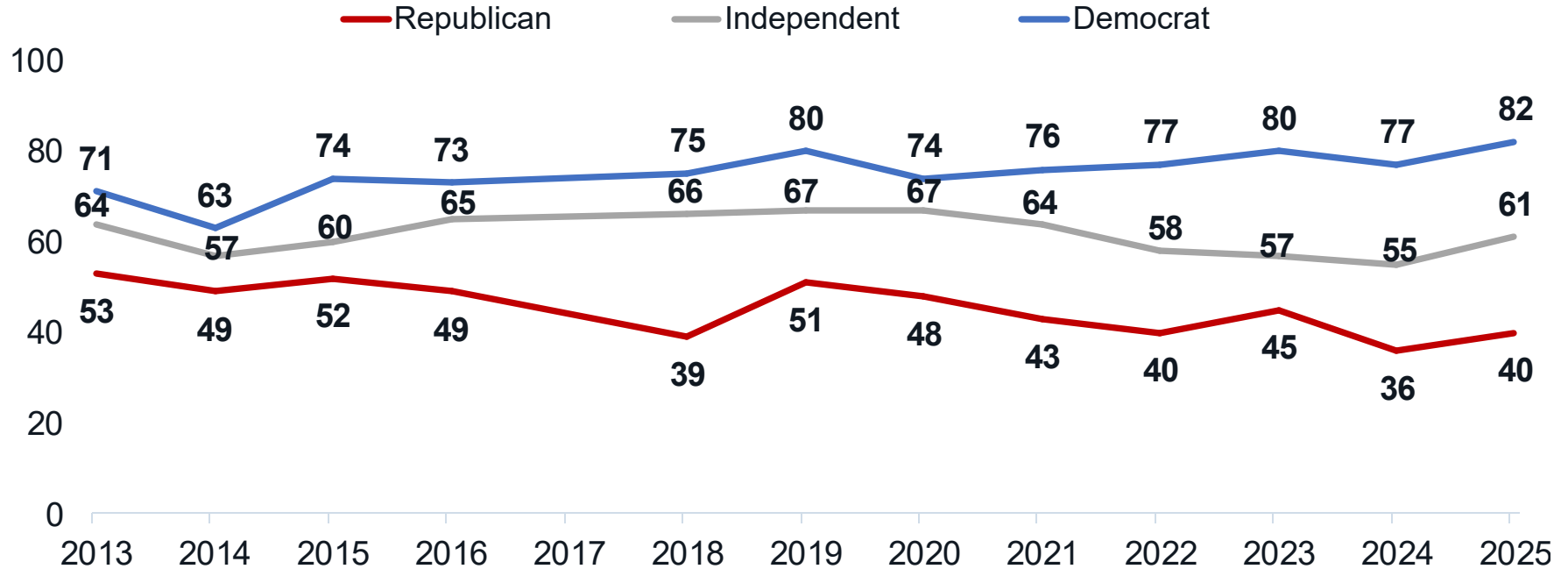

Support for a Pathway to Citizenship, 2013-2025, by Party Affiliation

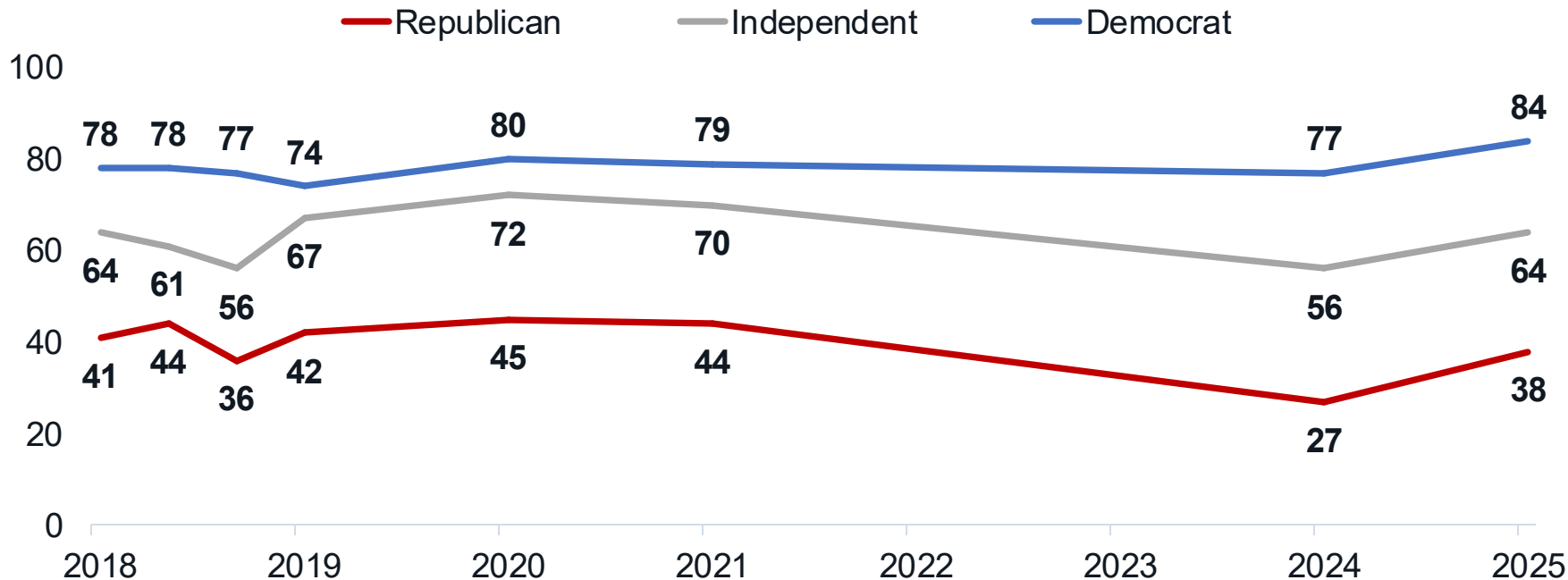
Immigrants living in the country illegally should be allowed to become citizens, provided they meet certain requirements:

Percent who favor allowing immigrants brought illegally to the U.S. as children to gain legal residence:

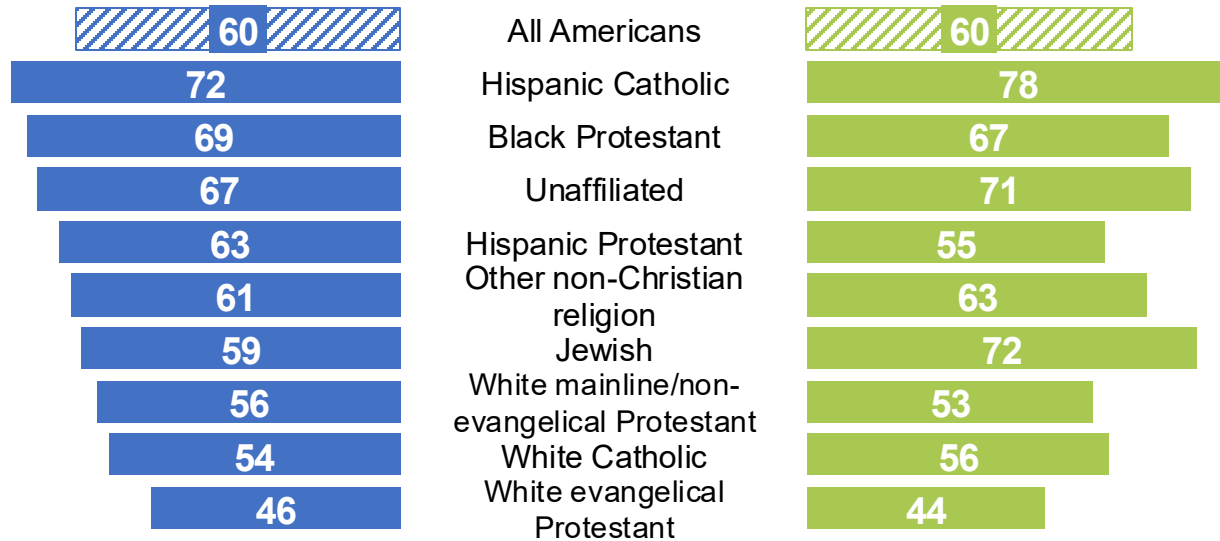

- Favor allowing immigrants brought illegally to the U.S. as children to gain legal residence.

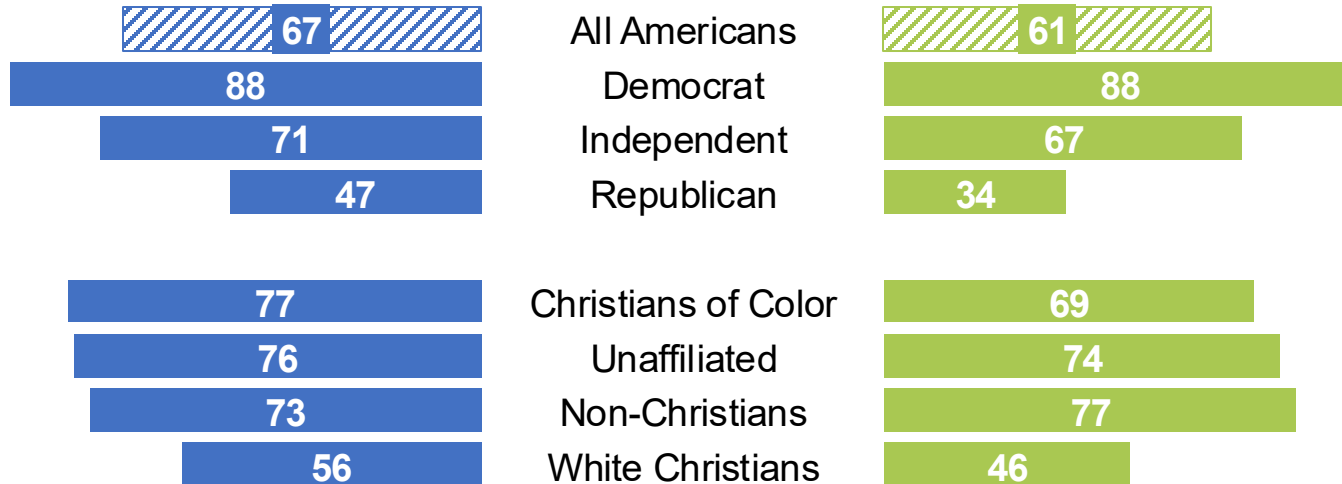

Percent who:

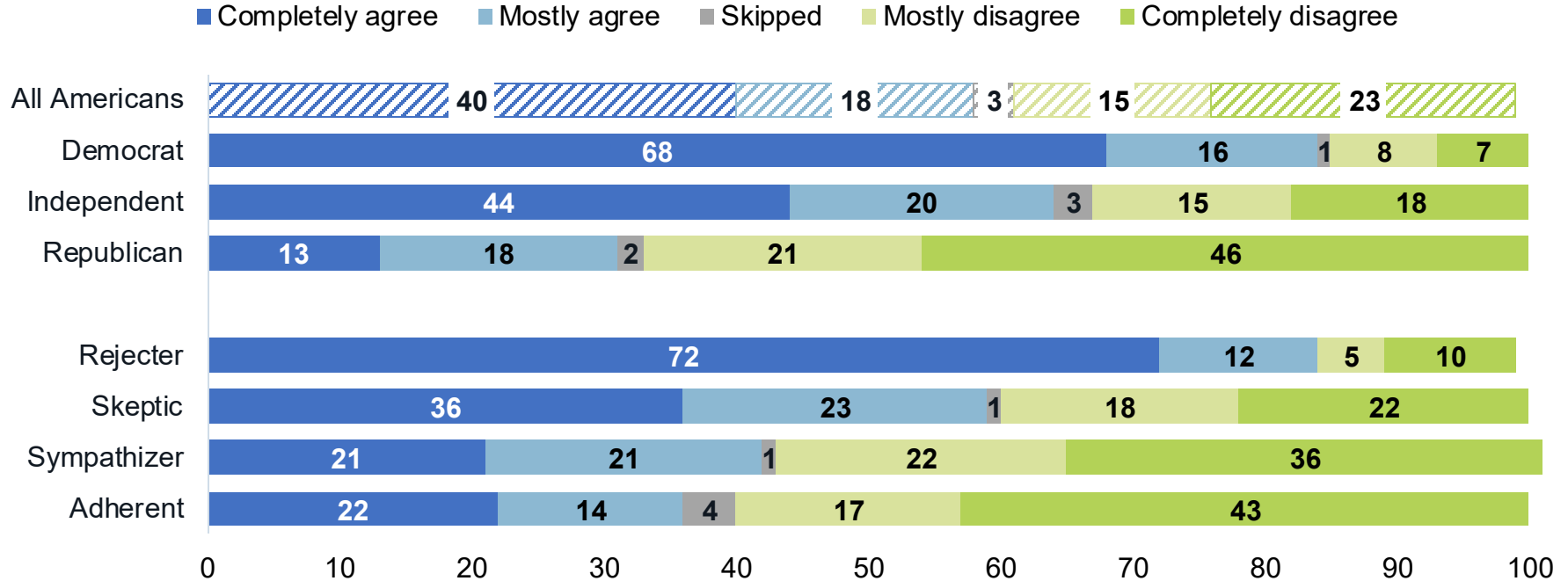
- Favor the U.S. Consitution's existing guarantee that all children who are born in the United States are automatically granted U.S. citizenship, regardless of their parents' citizenship status.

Support for Prohibiting ICE Officers From Concealing Their Identities, by Party and Christian Nationalism Groups

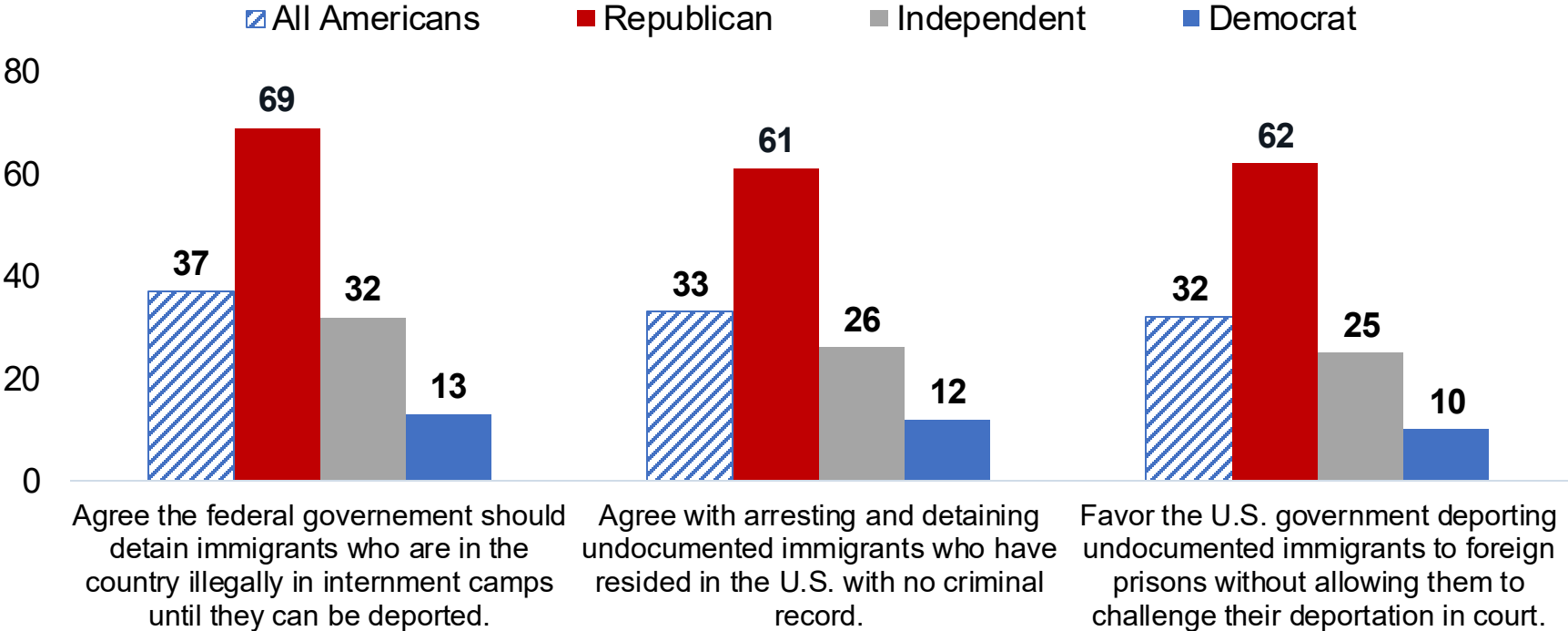
ICE officers should not be allowed to conceal their identity with masks or unmarked vehicles when arresting people:

Support for Arresting, Detaining, and Deporting Undocumented Immigrants by Party Affiliation

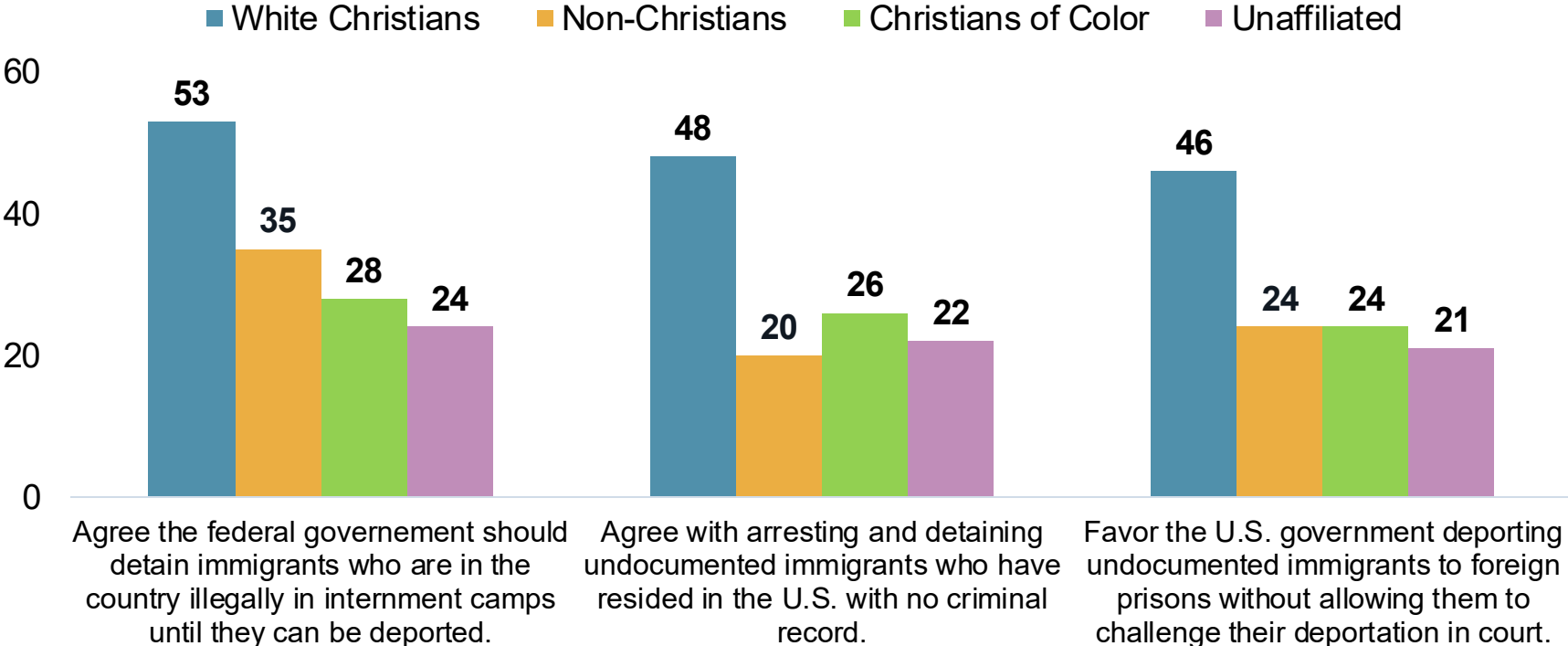

SUPPORT FOR TRUMP'S IMMIGRATION AGENDA

Questions Constituting the Immigration Policy Scale

Support

Arresting and detaining undocumented immigrants who have resided in the United States with no criminal record.

Detaining immigrants who are in the country illegally in internment camps until they can be deported.

Deporting undocumented immigrants to foreign prisons in El Salvador, Rwanda, or Libya, without allowing them to challenge their deportation in court.

Allowing ICE officers to conceal their identity with masks or use unmarked vehicles when arresting people.

Oppose

The U.S. Constitution's existing guarantee that all children who are born in the United States are automatically granted citizenship, regardless of their parents' citizenship status.

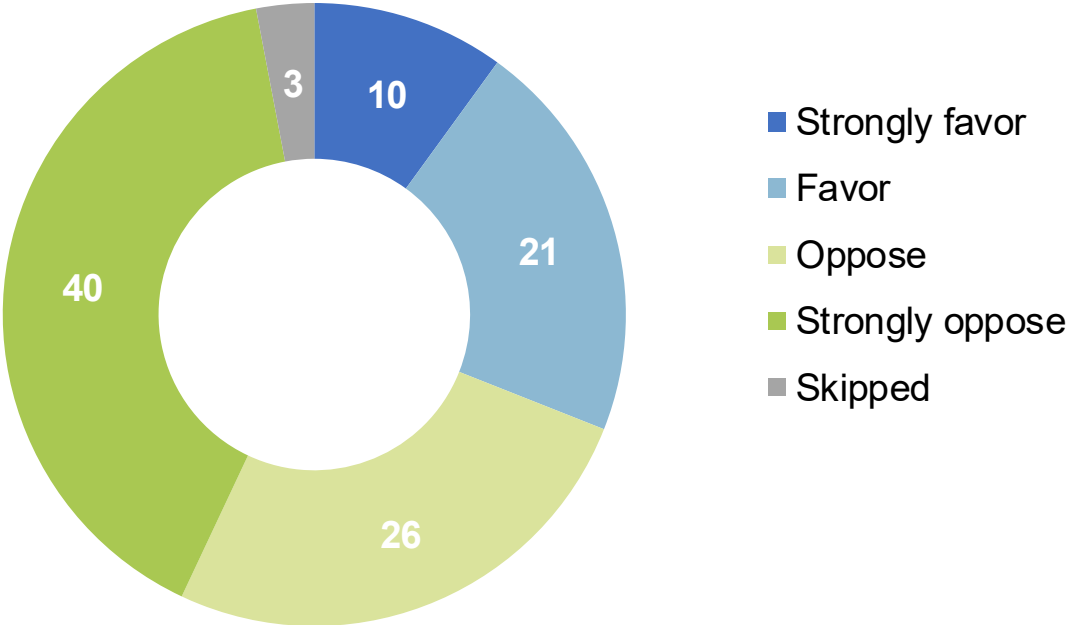
Allowing undocumented immigrants a way to become citizens provided they meet certain requirements.

Allowing immigrants brought illegally to the U.S. as children to gain legal resident status.

Immigrants, regardless of legal status, should have basic rights and protections, such as the ability to challenge their deportation before a judge in court.

Percent who ___ Trump's immigration agenda:



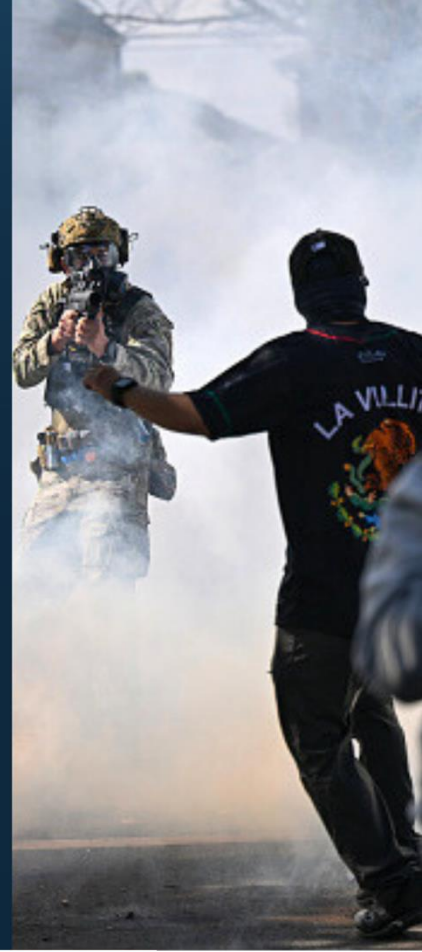
